

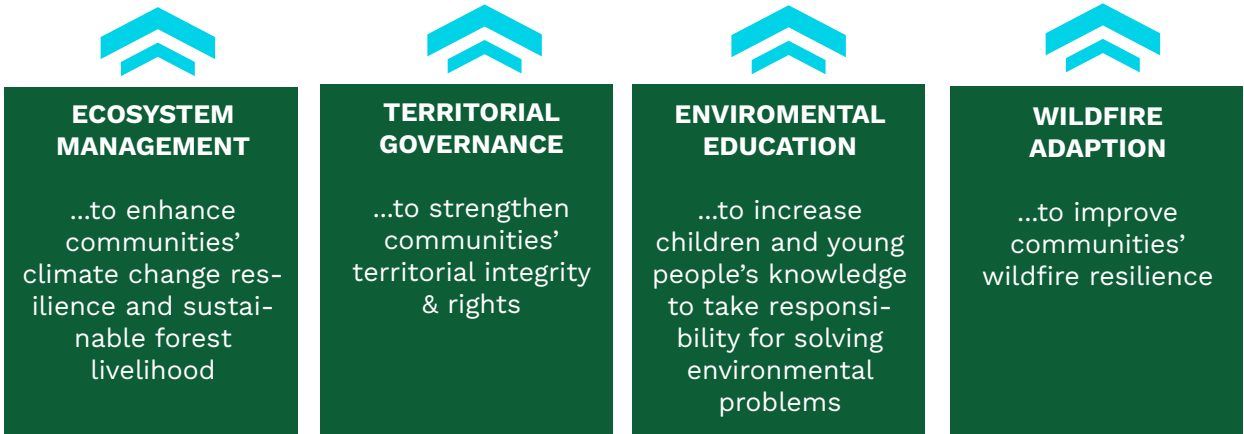

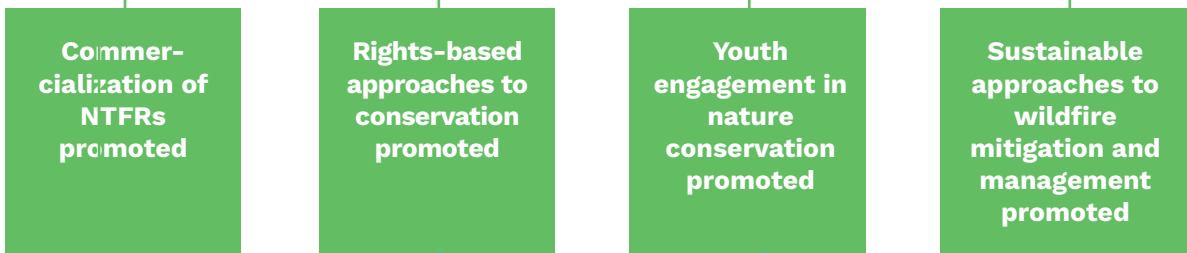
Goal

Establishing **Corridors of Forest**: Connecting and protecting forests either managed or owned by indigenous peoples and rural communities with areas under formal protection based on increased civil society sensitivity and skills to conserve nature.

Assumptions

- Increase in HH net income from exploitation of NTFRs reduces external pressure on indigenous territories and community forests.
- Communities through capacity development will manage forest resources sustainably and in a transparent and inclusive manner and avoid elite capture.
- Forest authorities at national and regional level possess both capacity and integrity to enforce environmental and indigenous law and rights.

PROBLEM STATEMENT

South America's forests are disappearing at an alarming rate. Every year, more than 8,000 km² of rainforest in South America is forested or burned to make way for soybean, palm oil and cattle productions and in search of timber. If the devastation continues, researchers fear that the tropical forest areas in South America will disappear - they call it 'tipping point'.
